The New York Times WASHINGTON — Reacting to a series of highly publicized rapes on college campuses, the White House is increasing the pressure on universities to more sailts on campus. Administration officials re-leased guidelines Monday that colleges should follow, including recommendations that admin-istrators conduct anonymous surveys of sexual assault cases. The White House is likely to ask Congress for measures that would enforce the recommen-
